

This course is designed as an introductory approach for the physical therapist, physical therapist assistant and athletic trainer to amputee rehabilitation, primarily in the outpatient setting. This course will address evaluation and treatment both pre and post prosthetic receipt. We will also review amputee levels, prosthetic components and function, and special testing to allow the therapist to adequately communicate with the patient's prosthetist and be able to appropriately educate and train the patient in normalizing the gait pattern and reducing reliance on assistive devices.

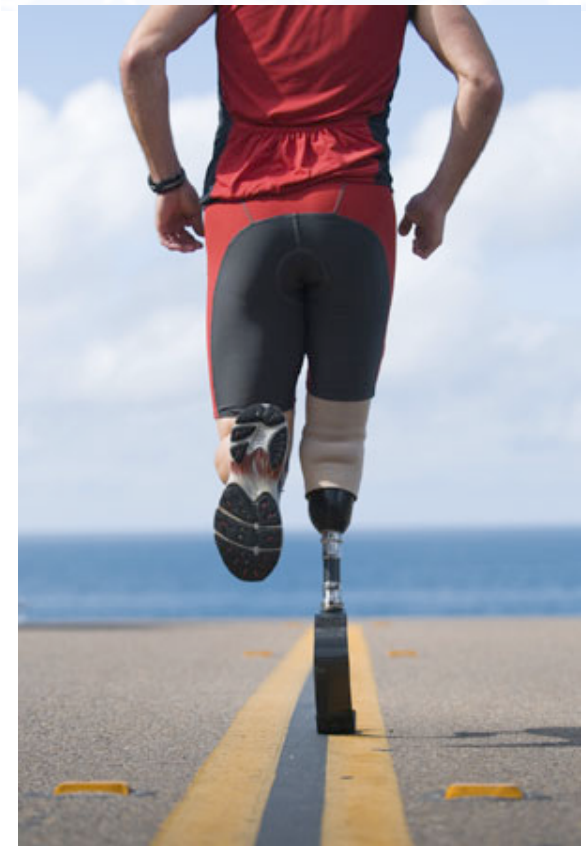
